Course Description:

A survey of the major doctrines of the Bible: Theology Proper, Bibliology, Christology, Pneumatology, Angelology, Anthropology, Hamartiology, Soteriology, Ecclesiology, and Eschatology. Special attention is given to the central passages of Scripture dealing with each doctrine.

Course Objectives and Procedures:

A. Academic Objectives and Procedures:

1. Objectives

- To understand the major doctrines of Scripture in general
- To know the primary Scripture dealing with each major doctrine
- To establish a theological framework of biblical interpretation

2. Procedures

- Classroom lecture and discussion
- Required reading of textbook: Ryrie, *A Survey of Bible Doctrine*
- Required reading of biblical passages relating to specific doctrines
- Completion of Emmaus Correspondence Course, *Rightly Dividing the Word of Truth*
- Extensive use of visual aids

B. Applicational Objectives and Procedures:

1. Objectives

- To appreciate God and His revelation with a view to worship
- To understand the practical implications of doctrine with a view to application to the Christian life
- To establish a personal *Statement of Faith*

2. Procedures

- Devotional Emphasis
- Exhortative Emphasis
- Assignment to develop a *Statement of Faith*
